The Learning Room

Language and Literacy = Engagement, Belonging, Expression

Language and literacy are major domains of early childhood development. These are connected areas but refer to different things. Language development involves the development of the skills used to communicate with others through languages, while literacy development involves the ability to read and write. Ultimately language and literacy are the backbone of communication.

HIDDEN NAME ART PRESCHOOL NAME ACTIVITY

MATERIALS:

- watercolours or watered-down paint
- paint brush
- water cup
- white card stock or thick paper
- white crayon

GETTING STARTED

You can write out your child's name ahead of time with a white crayon on cardstock or thick white paper.

THE BIG NAME REVEAL!

You can then give them the card stock or paper and let them use watercolour or very watered-down paint to discover their name or whatever secret message you choose to write.

Kids will absolutely love uncovering and recognizing the familiar letters in their names!



Salt Tray Writing Practice

It is fun to let preschoolers practice writing with lots of different materials and utensils. One fun way to practice writing is to let them experiment using salt trays and a variety of utensils for writing.

To set up:

- Place a set of alphabet flash cards or letters that have been written on paper next to shallow trays of salt.
- Then provide, popsicle sticks, Q-Tips, straws, paintbrushes or whatever you have available for them to practice their letters.

The salt is easy to clean up as well...and you can save it to use for other activities.

Uppercase/Lowercase Letter Matching Game:

A great activity is to write on paper the letters in both Capital



and Small Letters. Then cut them out and play a matching game where they match the big letters with the small letters. This will introduce them to the beginnings of writing as we must use both capital and small letters when we compose sentences.

This can be done inside the home or on a walk through the neighbourhood.


Make your Alphabet List and then set off to find the letters to match. This is especially fun when walking outdoors because there are so many opportunities to find letters in unexpected places.


After the letters are found you can start finding objects that start with each letter of the alphabet.
